


AGRI-BUSINESS CENTER & BLACK MOUNTAIN EXCHANGE PROVIDE FIRST JOBS

It also includes the Black Mountain Exchange gas station and convenience store and Faithfully Fit, a gym and wellness center in nearby Cumberland. The newest venture is the Agri-Business Center where plants including Shiitake Mushrooms will been grown in the lower level of the old bathhouse building, where the cool, dark climate is perfect. To date we have provided about 15 part-time jobs through the Development Corp. "Here Today, Gone Tomorrow" by Pastor Charlie Lanier

"As for man, his days are like grass, he flourishes like a flower of the field; the wind blows over it and it is gone, and its place remembers it no more. But from everlasting to everlasting the Lord's love is with those who fear him." (Psalm 103:15-17)

For those living close to the river, there is an odd phenomenon that occurs each year. A peculiar looking insect called the Mayfly can be spotted for a brief period of time. Depending upon the circumstances, the bugs can suddenly inundate an area in plague like fashion. It's been said that some annual swarms can be tracked by radar. They don't bite or sting, but they can leave behind a pretty big mess.

The Mayfly only lives out their adult phase in about 24 hours. They would all molt wings and fly at roughly the same time. For a day, these bugs can take a town hostage, completely covering the railings on bridges and dimming street lamps. During this one day they mate. The females land on the water, lay their eggs, and are likely eaten by fish. The males venture off over land, destined to get hit by a windshield, or fly till they fall to the ground to fly no more. After a heavy rain or strong wind, the Mayfly is quickly forgotten until the next year.

James, the brother of Jesus, writes, "Why you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes." (James 4:14)

Among other things, the Bible compares our life to the flower quickly fading, to a vapor – a mere puff of steam. Life is short and death is certain. In view of eternity, our 100 years is but a blink of the eye. Our possessions, achievements, experiences – all gone at sunset. We are here today and gone tomorrow. We are as fragile as the Mayfly.

Because life is so short, we are tempted to cry out with King Solomon, "Utterly meaningless! Everything is meaningless." However, we are created in the image of God and with purpose. God has created us to long for meaning and significance. We are created deep down to long for the eternal. This painful yearning is a void only Jesus can fill.

At the end of Solomon's search for meaning in Ecclesiastes, he finally finds what he's searching for. "Here is the conclusion of the matter: Fear God." In a hundred years, in a thousand years when our names are no longer remembered, there's God. The only thing that will last, the only thing that truly matters is God.

When the Son of God walked the earth, quite a few people approached him asking, "What must I do to inherit eternal life? What must I do to enter the Kingdom of God?" They were in effect asking how they could escape death.

In response Jesus proclaims the Gospel – "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only son, that whosoever believes in him shall not perish, but have everlasting life. For God did not send his son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him." (John 3:16-17)
